SYLVIA OLIVAS: Well, well, well.

DAVID GAVALDON: When did you get my letter?

SYLVIA OLIVAS: I got it yesterday. I finally got your letter yesterday, but --

DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

SYLVIA OLIVAS: The guy that you came to court she had my number.

DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, yeah.

SYLVIA OLIVAS: His wife.

DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she called me I think it was Thursday. And she called me and she told me that -- or earlier this week after court and all that.

DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

SYLVIA OLIVAS: She called and told me that you were here.

DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

SYLVIA OLIVAS: And -- you look good.

DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

SYLVIA OLIVAS: You look really good. I don't know it's 'cause we're happy 'cause you're here or what.

1           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. I ain't got no light in  
2 here.

3           SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah, no light. Oh, my God. Wow.  
4 So I called Brian and I -- and I told him what you had  
5 said and everything.

6           DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

7           SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he was very, extremely happy  
8 that you were here. He said I feel like it's  
9 Christmas. He said tell him that I wish I was the one  
10 that was in there instead of him. I wish we could  
11 trade places.

12          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. We could have that.

13          SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he said that, you know, to  
14 give his love and, you know, send his love and his  
15 brother sends his love. And they both came to the  
16 house last night.

17          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

18          SYLVIA OLIVAS: I told them that, you know, that  
19 they're -- you know, the situation and everything  
20 you're here.

21          DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

22          SYLVIA OLIVAS: And they were very, extremely  
23 happy.

24          DAVID GAVALDON: That's cool.

25          SYLVIA OLIVAS: Very, extremely happy. And you

1       should have seen them, man, he had a biggest smile.

2             DAVID GAVALDON:   Yeah.

3             SYLVIA OLIVAS:   And he said that -- oh, he told me  
4       to tell you that he learned how to play baseball real  
5       good.  He been playing a lot of baseball.  And he --  
6       so, also I want to -- like the things that I have on my  
7       mind to tell you.

8             DAVID GAVALDON:   Uh-huh.

9             SYLVIA OLIVAS:   That Junior was -- he wants to  
10      talk to Brian because his girlfriend came over and  
11      asked -- had a list of things that she needed money  
12      for.

13            DAVID GAVALDON:   Yeah.

14            SYLVIA OLIVAS:   And he told her -- all he did was  
15      give the little girl \$5.00 to go eat 'cause she said  
16      she was hungry.

17            DAVID GAVALDON:   Uh-huh.

18            SYLVIA OLIVAS:   And she said we -- we came over  
19      here, Uncle, to get some money 'cause we -- we want to  
20      eat.  And he said, okay, mija.  He took \$5.00 and gave  
21      it to her.  Hgo,    here, there's money for you.

22            DAVID GAVALDON:   Yeah.

23            SYLVIA OLIVAS:   And he told the girlfriend that,  
24      no, no money.

25            DAVID GAVALDON:   Uh-huh.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he said that he had dished out  
2 a lot of money when Junior was out.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And it just, you know, just it's  
5 like a constant like he's supposed to be like the ATM  
6 machine, like a bank. And he said, no. He said, no.  
7 But he gave the baby some -- \$5.00 for food. And now  
8 Dave -- he wants to go talk to him.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He wants to talk to Brian and  
11 settle that he refused to help his girlfriend.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: He ain't obligated to do that.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So, you know -- you know, and  
14 somebody -- somebody already said something to him. I  
15 guess, somebody came and told him, you know, that --

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- Junior wants to talk to you  
18 about this how you turned, you know, his girlfriend  
19 away.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he says, well, first of all  
22 he's not, you know, he's not my homeboy.

23 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: That's number one.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he said -- and he's nobody to  
2 me right now. You know. But, you know, he's like us  
3 he'll always give somebody money for food.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But he did help him a lot.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, I know he did. Well, not  
7 just him but several people.

8 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah. And I just wanted to tell  
9 you -- he didn't tell me to tell you that.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But I'm just telling you that on  
12 my own because of the fact that Junior wants to go talk  
13 to him afterwards.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And I don't know, you know --

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Where's Junior at?

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- what that means.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Where's Junior at?

19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He's locked up.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh. Yeah, he didn't -- you tell  
21 him -- you just tell him that you told me and that I  
22 said that he's not obligated to do anything.

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Okay.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: You know, the only -- the only  
25 reason why he was doing it in the first place taking

1 care of her 'cause I asked him to.

2 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yes.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: But she continued to use it has a  
4 -- to play on my kindness and just continue to go to,  
5 not just him, but she was going to three different  
6 people.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: Within the same month.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: So she was accumulating like, you  
11 know, a couple thousand dollars, you know. So I cut  
12 her -- I told everybody, man, to cut her loose.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: You know, because I haven't heard  
15 from her since they broke up.

16 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: You know, but yet she still  
18 thinks she's inclined to be able to go down there and  
19 get money, you know, based on our -- our relationship.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: And I got fed up with it. And  
22 then like I said, knucklehead he -- he'd been promising  
23 all these things about he's going to shape up and do  
24 this and do that. And he expects me to just make him a  
25 rich man overnight, you know.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: And that's not going to happen  
3 because I want him to show me first if he's going to be  
4 a father and a husband to his family.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: If he can't be that then I don't  
7 want nothing to do with him.

8 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: And he's never written me when he  
10 broke up with Monique. He's never written me and  
11 explained his situation to me. You know.

12 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: And so I'm through with him.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He's a -- if he had -- Brian  
15 helped us with the driveway and all that. And he had  
16 asked him for his help.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He asked him to come to my house  
19 and help with the work.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he -- the first time he asked  
22 him he didn't show up.

23 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And then the next time he asked  
25 him what happened -- oh, he was at -- where he usually

1 hangs out.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And if he had been working on my  
4 driveway he'd still be a free man.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: 'Cause that's where they -- they  
7 picked him up.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Over there. And, you know, there  
10 was a lot of surveillance going on over there. 'Cause  
11 I even saw the helicopter.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And they were way high up and I  
14 go, darn, look at the helicopter they're watching  
15 somebody. And I thought it was my house 'cause all  
16 these guys were there.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But it wasn't my house at all. It  
19 was over there in the neighborhood.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: In another neighborhood.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So that's what happened to him.

24 But I was concerned when he said that about, you know,  
25 Brian.

1           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS: What Brian told me. I said, can I  
3 -- is it okay if I tell David about this?

4           DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

5           SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know, 'cause I don't what --  
6 what he -- what his intentions are.

7           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. I'll -- I'll get at my  
8 friend over there that's over there with the  
9 knucklehead and tell him to just shut his trap.

10          SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

11          DAVID GAVALDON: 'Cause he's probably just doing  
12 that upon himself. Like, he feels that like Brian is  
13 obligated to do something for me. He's not.

14          SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

15          DAVID GAVALDON: You know, he's not obligated to  
16 do nothing. In fact, the idiot he never did nothing  
17 for me.

18          SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

19          DAVID GAVALDON: When he was out, you know.

20          SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

21          DAVID GAVALDON: He's never sent me. In fact,  
22 he's gone to -- he used to go to Victor and tell  
23 Victor, well, hey, man, I got some money can you -- do  
24 you think I can send it to my dad. And I'm like, why  
25 in the hell is he asking you whether or not he could

1 send money to me? That doesn't make sense, you know.  
2 And that just insults my intelligence.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Exactly.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: So -- and then plus for  
5 everything I've already done for him.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: I mean, he's never had the  
8 decency to even write me and, you know, kiss my ass. I  
9 would have respected that.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And you did. You gave him a lot.  
11 You know, in my opinion, I believe that you gave him a  
12 lot more than he deserved.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, of course.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: That's what I think.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

16 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know, you were real good to  
17 him. He -- he can't cry about that.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: No. He's -- he's not getting no  
19 more.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: When you -- when he needed you you  
21 were there for him.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But that's the way that kid is.  
24 And I told Brian I said I'll be hearing from him.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: He's -- he's burned his bridges  
3 with me. I'm through with him. Unless he changes his  
4 colors and gets out and does something more, you know,  
5 productive. I don't want nothing to do. I ain't got  
6 nothing to hear -- I don't want -- there's nothing that  
7 he could possibly tell me that's going to change my  
8 opinion towards him.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: His girlfriend too -- I wanted to  
12 tell you before I forget 'cause we've only got one  
13 hour.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: His girlfriend has messed up the  
16 relationship with Brian's wife.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Because she's been -- she likes to  
19 just talk and --

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- and she like been educating her  
22 and schooling her on the ways of -- of, you know, how  
23 Brian is.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she does -- and so his wife

1 was pretty ignorant to what kind of work he did and all  
2 that. But now that -- that Junior's girlfriend --

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- you know, educated her in other  
5 words.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Now she's giving -- they're  
8 separated.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Brian and his wife are separated  
11 because basically because of his -- of that girlfriend.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she's been -- she liked to  
14 talk big.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

16 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know. She acts like her name  
17 is Gavaldon. And like if -- she's just a real troubled  
18 young lady.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So if she comes trouble for -- for  
21 **Andar**. said do you mind if I tell my brother what's  
22 happened here and how your marriage has been  
23 affected by this girl?

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He said, sure, go ahead tell him.

1 But, you know, it's -- the damage is already done.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: My wife doesn't want to come back  
4 and she wants me to change the way, you know, I do  
5 certain things. And because now she's been you know --

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- told all this information.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And now she doesn't want to be  
10 with me.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Well, it's --

12 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And so that's what happened with  
13 that.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: You -- you can rectify that I'm  
15 sure. I mean, he has kids with her. It has to be  
16 something he could repair.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. But I'll get at that dummy  
19 when I get back. I'll probably be gone by Monday.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: That's what I figured.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: They don't want me here.

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: We -- it took us six hours to get  
23 through on the phone. Six hours.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I was using the cell phone and

1 dialing the phone. I think I used all my minutes. And  
2 then I was tired. And I was tired of calling and  
3 calling and calling. And I was getting frustrated,  
4 very frustrated because I couldn't get through.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: If I made -- I made more than a  
7 thousand calls. I know I did.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: 'Cause you could figure every  
10 minute I redialed and redialed.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

12 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And then when Monica got up I told  
13 her what happened and she took over.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She took over calling. And she  
16 got through. And I called Joe and I said, you know,  
17 crying. Joe, I can't get through. And he prayed for  
18 me and we -- Monica finally got through.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So -- but, I mean -- and you can  
21 only call from certain hours.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And at 2:03 Monica was talking to  
24 somebody.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah, that's the -- 'cause

1 there's only 15 people they allow from my -- the ad  
2 seg.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Only 15 people could be how -- so  
5 you have to be within that 15 people.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh, my God.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: And then they do that. They make  
8 it a burden just so that you'll give up. They know  
9 that people are going be trying -- you can't get  
10 through 'cause it's always busy.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: It's horrible.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. They do it intentionally.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: That's what I told Monica.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I said this is a strategy --

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah, of course.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- to keep us from coming. I said  
18 we have to go 'cause the last time they whisk him away  
19 and they're going to do this again --

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- 'cause that girl said that --  
22 when the -- your friend's wife called me.

23 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She said that I call her back  
25 yesterday. 'Cause I said I'm having trouble getting

1 through. I said, are you sure I got the right  
2 information? He goes -- he says, yes.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She said, but he may already be  
5 gone because it's all over and they don't need him and  
6 they got him in separately. And she was mad --

7 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

8 SYLVIA OLIVAS: 'Cause they took her -- they took  
9 her out of the court. And she couldn't even see  
10 anybody and she had no stories to tell 'cause she found  
11 nothing.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: They -- they had me on three-car  
13 escort and put a hood over my head.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh, my God.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: It was ugly, man. They -- these  
16 people even coming down they had me -- they came in  
17 Sunday morning they just woke me up.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: About 3:00 told me come on, pack  
20 your stuff, you're leaving. I said, I'm not going  
21 nowhere, fool. He said, yeah, you're going out to  
22 court. I already knew that he was going to try to  
23 subpoena me.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: So I assumed that it was that.

1 So I said, all right. 'Cause that's the only reason  
2 why I agreed to go.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: So, and then they took me  
5 straight to here 12 hours. I don't know the -- the  
6 handcuffs was terrible, you know.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: My God.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: And they put a little box over  
9 the handcuffs so it's just on your wrist. I had fat-  
10 ass wrist when I got down here, you know.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh, my God.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: And then when I went Thursday to  
13 court they made a big ol' damn deal out of it, you  
14 know. It's just too much.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: They're -- they're really  
16 paranoid.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: I wasn't even back here when  
18 they're already making phone calls to somebody in  
19 Pelican Bay we don't want this guy here you got to get  
20 him out of here, you know.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh, my God.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: It's just --

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I was very concerned they were  
24 going to take you last night.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, hell, I thought it was going

1 to be right after court, shit. That's how -- that's  
2 how they are. They're like, man, you know, and then  
3 it's me. So --

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: When did you go to court?

5 DAVID GAVALDON: Thursday.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Okay.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: I went Thursday.

8 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So we're barely -- yeah, they're  
9 probably warming up the engine right now.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Well, when I said when I  
11 got back here Thursday they already told me. See, we  
12 just got off the phone, man, we're trying to get you  
13 out of here.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Wow.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: I think, damn, I'm might miss you  
16 guys so I said, man. But I'm thinking --

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: We were praying

18 DAVID GAVALDON: -- Sunday morning. Sunday  
19 morning or Monday for sure.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: I'd be surprised if I'm here  
22 Tuesday. Yeah.

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Well, I -- you know, of course, I  
24 didn't give anybody any options.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: 'Cause I told them we're going to  
2 go visit David and he's here next weekend. 'Cause I  
3 knew how this goes. And maybe next weekend it could be  
4 your turn.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. I'll be gone, I know I  
6 will.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: That's what I've heard. 'Cause  
8 Nancy said John and I will go.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: They all volunteer. And then  
11 Kimmie said her and Jeremy will come.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: 'Cause they wanted to come and  
14 visit. But we're going to plan on visiting you next  
15 month.

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And I'm going to apply for the  
18 extended visit.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah. But we'll be visiting you.  
21 Monica will be visiting too.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: How she doing?

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She's doing good. She's doing  
24 really good. And let me -- okay, I'll let you talk  
25 right now. Now -- so Victor, I -- I call him last time

1 night and told him, you know, that you were down here  
2 and everything.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he goes, I think he's gone. I  
5 go, man, you're negative.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Ain't nobody got no faith.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Well, I'm not giving up. And he  
8 said I think he's gone. I heard he's gone.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I go, well, wait a minute, I just  
11 made an appointment today and they wouldn't have made  
12 me an appointment if he's not there. So I just got to  
13 hope they don't whisk him off tonight.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Then he called me in the morning,  
16 at 7:00 in the morning, he goes, I heard that anybody  
17 could go visit and I don't need to make an appointment.  
18 And he says I like to go with you.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh. For one hour.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I said, um. He said, what time  
21 are you leaving? I said, we're leaving any minute.  
22 We're getting my daughter ready. We're going to get in  
23 the van right now. He goes, man, I would sure like to  
24 see him.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And I said I know for a fact you  
2 need a visit. They asked me -- this time they asked us  
3 for all the names --

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- of who was coming. And -- and  
6 they give us an appointment time. You can't get in  
7 there. He said, but I heard. Can't you just give me  
8 the number so I can call myself? I said it took me six  
9 hours to get through.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. He could wait.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He felt bad. And he said to -- to  
12 send his hellos and his love. And he really likes you  
13 a lot because he wanted to come and -- he wanted to  
14 hitch a ride with us.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: No. It's just -- 'cause you have  
16 all that dissension out there right now.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: So -- but remember that  
19 knucklehead that went to the house?

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: Well, see, I ran into him. And  
22 now -- now he's on his knees, you know. Man, you know,  
23 I shouldn't have did that and all that. They're all  
24 scared to death down here.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

1           DAVID GAVALDON: Because they know.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

3           DAVID GAVALDON: And it's easy. You know, it's

4 easy -- well, if I'm not present then they can do

5 whatever they do behind my back. It's another damn

6 thing when they got to do it in front of my face.

7           SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

8           DAVID GAVALDON: And they're scared to death right

9 now, you know. They're writing me all this little

10 cash. You know, man, I'm sorry, didn't -- I didn't

11 mean to do this. And then with the Brian -- situation

12 with Brian they're all scared to death.

13           SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

14           DAVID GAVALDON: You know, 'cause they know they

15 messed up, this should have never happened.

16           SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

17           DAVID GAVALDON: But another thing let Brian know.

18 'Cause I know he's a little harsh on all these guys.

19 See, he has to understand, man, he cannot be harsh with

20 these guys and just because they don't succumb to do

21 what he says then so what.

22           SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

23           DAVID GAVALDON: Then just leave them alone. You

24 know. Because the -- I'm not going to tolerate that

25 either from him.

DAVID GAVALDON: He should know how to do that. I wouldn't do it. You know, I've never done it my entire life.

SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

DAVID GAVALDON: And I don't expect him to do it.

SYLVIA OLIVAS: Okay.

DAVID GAVALDON: And he has to understand that,

1 man. 'Cause I don't want pay favors to him if I find  
2 out he's abusing my kindness in a wrong way.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Victor -- I know Victor doesn't.  
5 You know, he's a good man and I respect him. And I  
6 write his sister so they're all jolly, you know.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: But I know Brian has that  
9 problem.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Sometimes he'll let that dictate  
12 his better judgment.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: And I will not forgive him for  
15 that. 'Cause I'm not going to let him use that as an  
16 excuse, well, I wasn't in a right mind.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: He should be in a right mind.

19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Especially when he's speaking to  
21 my behalf.

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

23 DAVID GAVALDON: He has to understand that.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: 'Cause I will not tolerate either

1 from him. You know.

2 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Roy -- Roy also regarding all that  
3 incident.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Roy had said that he had heard a  
6 lot of bad stuff too.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

8 SYLVIA OLIVAS: About this one individual. And,  
9 you know, so I -- even over there they heard bad stuff.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: We're -- we're infuriated.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: The fact that he went and knocked  
13 on your door I'll just -- words can't even compare with  
14 -- I'll deal with it when I --

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Well, he didn't actually come to  
16 my house.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: What did he do?

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But he just, you know --

21 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- was confronting Brian. That  
23 was the only problems that he had.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And then he had a little following

1 and all that. You know.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah, I know.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Well, all those guys are scared to  
4 death. 'Cause now they know they're misled to believe  
5 something that wasn't true.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: Now, they're all -- they're all  
8 they want to get on their knees and apologize to me,  
9 but I don't want their apologies. You shouldn't do  
10 this from the beginning. You know, I don't treat you  
11 guys in this form or fashion nor do I expect you to  
12 conduct yourself that towards me.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: But like I said it's easy to act  
15 like a tough guy when you're out there and my presence  
16 is not there. It's another thing when I am there and  
17 now that I am here --

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: -- you know, it's a whole  
20 different damn story. Oh, man, I didn't know this. I  
21 don't know that. That's irrelevant.

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

23 DAVID GAVALDON: The fact is you should have  
24 known. You know. Just the fact that it was me it  
25 should have been enough for you just to back away.

SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

DAVID GAVALDON: You know. His -- like I said his brother, his father, mother. I know them all, they're loyalty to me I know is flawless.

SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

DAVID GAVALDON: You know. I know he would never ~~But at the same time - I don't know~~ that and he's not using his better judgment at times.

SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

DAVID GAVALDON: And that's his fault and he needs to stop that.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah. That's what his wife wants  
2 him to stop too.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Well, you tell him what I  
4 said, man. I'm not going to pay favoritism to him.  
5 You know, I care a great deal for him, but doesn't mean  
6 I won't spank his ass too.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: If he's wrong.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: You know.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I'll tell him.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I'll tell him. He's -- he's  
14 taking care of that gift.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

16 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He's taking care of that.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Well, I sent it out early because  
20 over there, man, the mail is bad.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: They got us under a microscope,  
23 man.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah. He's got the cards and  
25 everything.

1           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS: He said he's taking care of it.

3           DAVID GAVALDON: All right.

4           SYLVIA OLIVAS: And then Roy with his situation

5 I'm not sure -- we're still not sure about his

6 situation.

7           DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

8           SYLVIA OLIVAS: Because his stories change, you

9 know.

10          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11          SYLVIA OLIVAS: And Roy is a big ol' fibber.

12          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

13          SYLVIA OLIVAS: And I don't know if he -- the beat

14 -- the beating that he got.

15          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

16          SYLVIA OLIVAS: If it was -- he got the worst end

17 of it or what.

18          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

19          SYLVIA OLIVAS: And I'm thinking maybe he doesn't

20 want me to see him or any of the family to see him if

21 he's messed up still. You know. When he got into some

22 kind of altercation with somebody in there and he said

23 it was personal.

24          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

25          SYLVIA OLIVAS: But I don't think that was it --

1 that it at all.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Well, this is just  
3 recently again?

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: It was -- no, it was about, you  
5 know, just a few months ago.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, yeah.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And out of that that's why they  
8 put him in lock up. And now he says he can't have  
9 contact visits.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And now he, you know, he's just --  
12 he's got all kinds of problems.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But they let him stay in  
15 California.

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he -- they thought that that  
18 he could help with the situation and keep peace. And  
19 that's what he said.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Yeah.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: That -- that he could help the  
22 harmony of all that. So I don't know how much that's  
23 true. But like I said --

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- sometimes I don't know when

1 he's telling the truth and when he -- 'cause he changes  
2 the story sometimes.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And you he thinks I'm dumb.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Well, I'm sure -- there's  
6 some other guys there that I know so I'm checking with  
7 them to find out what's going on. 'Cause I know he's  
8 not going to tell us or nothing.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: That's good, yeah.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Because we -- I keep asking him I  
12 want, you know, to visit. I want to see you. I want  
13 to, you know, go -- me and Monica and Joe.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But he doesn't -- he -- well, we  
16 could visit him with the mirror.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But he said -- I mean, the glass.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But he doesn't want to. He said I  
21 don't want a non contact visit.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I want to wait till we can have a  
24 contact visit. And so that's what, you know, he says  
25 he's waiting for. But I haven't seen him since last

1 year.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Well, that's how they  
3 punish those guys over there. They end up taking their  
4 contact visits, their restrictions, canteen  
5 restrictions. That's how the Feds punish their people.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But they still let him talk. They  
7 let him call on the phone.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So that's -- you know, that's all  
10 he needs. Oh, yeah, and they took his email away too,  
11 they punished him on that.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He probably wrote something he  
14 shouldn't have or received some messages.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

16 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But, you know, of course they  
17 monitor it all.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Does he know the circumstances  
19 about that -- his rib?

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: What -- what -- what, he don't  
22 care?

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He doesn't seem to care. He -- he  
24 -- you know, by the way, you know Julie when she --  
25 she's in jail right now.

1           DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she was diagnosed -- what,  
3 bipolar.

4           DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, yeah.

5           SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know, mental problems.

6           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

7           SYLVIA OLIVAS: Well, we knew that; right?

8           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah, long time ago.

9           SYLVIA OLIVAS: We're not even doctors and we  
10 knew. And -- and so now he's saying, you know, like  
11 she's got this problem, blah blah blah. And they're  
12 trying to get her into a rehab home instead of going to  
13 prison.

14          DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

15          SYLVIA OLIVAS: And the last time I -- I tried to  
16 do -- go that route, you know, I -- and I -- she  
17 understood it, Roy understood it. I'm just trying to  
18 get -- jump through the hoops, go through the program,  
19 stay out of prison.

20          DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

21          SYLVIA OLIVAS: She chose prison.

22          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

23          SYLVIA OLIVAS: She chose prison. That's her  
24 choice. But I think they can't find her a place right  
25 now 'cause it has to be, you know, a Christian home

1 they could find her like that.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: That's the Lily. Lily runs  
3 the --

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Well, see, yeah. But she -- Julie  
5 doesn't want the Christian program.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, that's --

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She -- she wants not go to prison.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: Go do her time then.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And that's all -- they're all  
10 free. Well, they're free to a certain -- they're  
11 government funds.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But they -- they get when they're  
14 in the home they can apply for. It's like 300-and  
15 something dollars a month, but the home gets that  
16 money --

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- to have them there.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But I -- she's got another court  
21 date and she was supposed to -- the last court date she  
22 had she was supposed to go to court -- the lawyer was  
23 supposed to bring the information for the rehab home. But  
24 nothing -- I guess nothing happened and now she's  
25 got another court date later this month. That girl go

1 -- they take her to court a lot.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Something going on right  
3 there.

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: I don't care about her, man.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah. And I don't have any  
7 contact with her. She didn't call me this time around.  
8 You know, 'cause she knows. I haven't talked to her  
9 since she bad-mouthed you and David -- Roy.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And Roy was upset because I was --  
12 didn't want anything to do with her.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: 'Cause she -- you know, I felt  
15 that was really bad what she did. Well, you know I'm  
16 your sister.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And I took it personal.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Like you're my brother.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I don't want her saying bad  
23 things.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So that was the last time I ever

1 spoke to her.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she tried to call me after  
4 that. And then she tried also call me collect from the  
5 last time from the county jail.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And I stopped -- I didn't give her  
8 the permission to call me collect.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Only my brothers can call me  
11 collect.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Hey, also let Lena know that's  
13 the girl that called.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh, yeah.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Let her -- to call her  
16 know -- to let the -- Mike, that's her husband.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: That I apologize 'cause I  
19 couldn't testify. 'Cause the issues that he wanted me  
20 to make reference to I couldn't do it.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: It would have just opened up a  
23 bag of a can of worms for him.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I see.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: 'Cause once the prosecution would

1 have seen who they had on the stand she would have  
2 asked me questions.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I see.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: About this and about that. And  
5 there's no things -- I couldn't have done nothing.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Okay.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: I would have just said no  
8 contest. I ain't got nothing to say.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Okay.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: And so would have just hurt him,  
11 if anything.

12 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I see.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: But he needs to know. I'm sure  
14 ~~But before I heard that he couldn't help him out~~ raising, no, I  
15 couldn't -- I couldn't have done it.

16  
17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I see.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. So -- but --

19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Okay. I'll tell her. She was  
20 nice to call me.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She thought of me. She kept my  
23 number and she was very frustrated.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah, she's good people. They're  
25 -- they're -- because of him they're all hounding her

1 too, you know. The -- these idiots here are all  
2 putting pressure on her and stuff. And then plus I  
3 keep in contact with her once in a while. But she  
4 sends me books and things, you know.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: So I don't even know her  
7 personally. It's just him I know him. He was up there  
8 in Pelican Bay.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: But, you know, he introduced me  
11 to her and stuff. Married her and got out. And now he  
12 gets all this trouble.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. But he's probably going to  
15 get life.

16 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Wow.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. But he's in good hands.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Well, also Kimmie said she wrote  
19 you a letter and sent you some cookie money.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Last -- this last week, I think.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: That's probably up there.

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She's all involved with Jeremy  
24 being there. Jeremy was on medication and Elizabeth  
25 not wanting to come home. And she deals with all that.

1           DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS: She probably wrote it all about it  
3 to you.

4           DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

5           SYLVIA OLIVAS: But when we go up to visit you  
6 next month it's too much to talk about right now with  
7 Elizabeth.

8           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

9           SYLVIA OLIVAS: But she's a little psycho momma.

10          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11          SYLVIA OLIVAS: But I better let Monica say hi to  
12 you before -- 'cause she's going to hate me.

13          DAVID GAVALDON: What's up, youngster?

14          MONICA OLIVAS: Hi.

15          DAVID GAVALDON: How you doing?

16          MONICA OLIVAS: I'm okay.

17          DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, yeah. Are you keeping your  
18 spirits up?

19          MONICA OLIVAS: So-so.

20          DAVID GAVALDON: So-so.

21          MONICA OLIVAS: I'm trying to do, you know, my  
22 best.

23          DAVID GAVALDON: That's good. You got to try to  
24 move your arms. Exercise. You look like you lost some  
25 weight.

1 FEMALE MONICA: I know. That's what Kimmie said  
2 in the hospital.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. You took good.

4 MONICA OLIVAS: In the hospital. And then she  
5 said my stomach went down.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

7 MONICA OLIVAS: 'Cause the doctor said I have a  
8 lot of the tumors.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

10 MONICA OLIVAS: But I don't have no cancer at all.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: That's good. I'm happy to hear  
12 that.

13 MONICA OLIVAS: Yeah. No cancer. And I get to  
14 keep my ovaries. And that's important for women; they  
15 need that for their --

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

17 MONICA OLIVAS: -- for their health.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

19 MONICA OLIVAS: 'Cause even if you can't have a  
20 baby you still need some of those things.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

22 MONICA OLIVAS: And I'm just happy to see you and  
23 I just wanted to say --

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, yeah.

25 MONICA OLIVAS: -- thank you for your cards and

1 all your love and support. I really appreciate it.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Well, you know, that's what I'm

3 here for, you know.

4 MONICA OLIVAS: It's help me when I've been really

5 down, you know.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

7 MONICA OLIVAS: And you're the only one that I

8 will get up at 5:00 in the morning for.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: That's good. You take care

10 yourself, man. And don't be eating all that candy,

11 huh?

12 MONICA OLIVAS: I'm not eating so much candy.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. 'Cause you look good. You

14 lost a lot of weight on your face. You look good.

15 MONICA OLIVAS: Yeah. You could tell, huh?

16 That's what Kimmie said.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: You look good.

18 MONICA OLIVAS: She said it went down right here.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. You look good. Take care

20 of yourself.

21 MONICA OLIVAS: But I caught a cold. How you

22 been doing?

23 DAVID GAVALDON: I'm doing pretty good. You know,

24 considering, you know.

25 MONICA OLIVAS: And -- and guess what?

1           DAVID GAVALDON:  Huh?

2           MONICA OLIVAS:  I'm going to get a laptop.

3           DAVID GAVALDON:  Uh-huh.

4           MONICA OLIVAS:  And it's going to -- I could talk  
5 into it.

6           DAVID GAVALDON:  Oh, yeah.

7           MONICA OLIVAS:  I could write you at least once a  
8 week.

9           DAVID GAVALDON:  Oh, that's good.

10          MONICA OLIVAS:  'Cause I could say anything.  Oh,  
11 and also before I forget 'cause Roy -- when I had my  
12 surgery.

13          DAVID GAVALDON:  Uh-huh.

14          MONICA OLIVAS:  And they had to put me in the  
15 wheelchair early in the morning.

16          DAVID GAVALDON:  Uh-huh.

17          MONICA OLIVAS:  He would call at 7:00 in the  
18 morning --

19          DAVID GAVALDON:  That's good.

20          MONICA OLIVAS:  -- when Nancy went to see you.

21          DAVID GAVALDON:  Uh-huh.

22          MONICA OLIVAS:  And he said, did David say  
23 anything for me?

24          DAVID GAVALDON:  Uh-huh.

25          MONICA OLIVAS:  And did he have anything to say to

1 me?

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

3 MONICA OLIVAS: I'm all, no, he didn't say  
4 anything. And he kept calling and calling like four  
5 times. He's all, he didn't -- your mom -- this is what  
6 -- 'cause she was at work.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

8 MONICA OLIVAS: And she said David didn't say  
9 anything for me? So you don't have anything good to  
10 say?

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Well, just next time you talk to  
12 him tell him I send my love, man. Ain't nothing  
13 change, you know.

14 MONICA OLIVAS: Okay.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Tell all was good.

16 MONICA OLIVAS: Okay.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Everybody is all right. You  
18 know.

19 MONICA OLIVAS: Okay.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

21 MONICA OLIVAS: And that's what he always ask  
22 every time he writes -- I mean, he calls. David say  
23 anything about me? How's he doing?

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

25 MONICA OLIVAS: What does he say?

1           DAVID GAVALDON:    Yeah.

2           MONICA OLIVAS:    And --

3           DAVID GAVALDON:    If -- yeah, I'll write him.  I'll

4    try to write him when I get back.

5           MONICA OLIVAS:    I got a little cold.

6           DAVID GAVALDON:    Uh-huh.

7           MONICA OLIVAS:    And they stopped his letters from

8    Joley.

9           DAVID GAVALDON:    Yeah.  Wonder why?

10          MONICA OLIVAS:    You know, that's better.

11          DAVID GAVALDON:    Yeah.

12          MONICA OLIVAS:    For him, you know.

13          DAVID GAVALDON:    Uh-huh.

14          MONICA OLIVAS:    He's -- I know he doesn't think

15    so, but it -- you know.

16          DAVID GAVALDON:    Yeah.

17          MONICA OLIVAS:    It's safer.

18          DAVID GAVALDON:    Yeah.

19          MONICA OLIVAS:    And -- but he's doing good.

20          DAVID GAVALDON:    That's good.

21          MONICA OLIVAS:    But every time we ask him when can

22    we come see him.

23          DAVID GAVALDON:    Yeah.

24          MONICA OLIVAS:    He says, not yet.

25          DAVID GAVALDON:    Uh-huh.

1           MONICA OLIVAS: But I'm going to -- I was going to  
2 write to you the day that letter came.

3           DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, the letter -- my letter?

4           MONICA OLIVAS: Yeah. And then I was -- I had the  
5 computer on and everything.

6           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

7           MONICA OLIVAS: And the envelope.

8           DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

9           MONICA OLIVAS: I go, forget it, I'm not going to  
10 write him, he's coming. Oh, and also.

11          DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

12          MONICA OLIVAS: The -- the -- you were right. I  
13 sent the wrong book. It was one of the books I talked  
14 about with all the pictures. But it doesn't have any  
15 posters.

16          DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, yeah. Yeah, I know.

17          MONICA OLIVAS: It just has like (Inaudible). Do  
18 you still want it or should I --

19          DAVID GAVALDON: Well, not the (Inaudible) ones.  
20 I thought you had the ones with the pictures.

21          MONICA OLIVAS: The pictures. Okay. What I'm  
22 going to do is I'm going to order -- what do you want,  
23 a picture of like Jennifer Lopez or Selena?

24          DAVID GAVALDON: Well, I thought -- I thought it  
25 was one of just all the stars?

1           MONICA OLIVAS: Yeah. All the stars, but you have  
2 to buy one for them to send you that little --  
3           DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, all right.  
4           MONICA OLIVAS: It's just like two pages.  
5           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah, I'll buy it.  
6           MONICA OLIVAS: I'll buy it. It's only \$5.99.  
7           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
8           MONICA OLIVAS: And then they send you the --  
9           DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.  
10          MONICA OLIVAS: -- along with a picture --  
11          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
12          MONICA OLIVAS: -- they send you like it's -- like  
13 a poster board to -- of two.  
14          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
15          MONICA OLIVAS: And I'll take the staples out and  
16 I'll send it to you.  
17          DAVID GAVALDON: Okay.  
18          MONICA OLIVAS: And with a picture. But what kind  
19 of picture do you want? Like, what movie star?  
20          DAVID GAVALDON: I thought -- I thought it was all  
21 of them?  
22          MONICA OLIVAS: It only has the little and they're  
23 all a bunch of tiny little pictures.  
24          DAVID GAVALDON: I'll let you know when I get  
25 back.

1           MONICA OLIVAS:   Okay.

2           DAVID GAVALDON:  I'll write you a letter.

3           MONICA OLIVAS:   Okay.

4           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

5           MONICA OLIVAS:  Here, let me let you talk to my  
6 mom.

7           DAVID GAVALDON:  All right.

8           MONICA OLIVAS:  I love you very much, okay.

9           DAVID GAVALDON:  I love you too, man.  And you  
10 take care of yourself, huh?

11          MONICA OLIVAS:  I will.

12          DAVID GAVALDON:  All right.  Bye.

13          MONICA OLIVAS:  Don't give up on me.

14          DAVID GAVALDON:  All right.

15          MONICA OLIVAS:  I just get depressed.

16          DAVID GAVALDON:  All right.  I hear you.

17          JOE OLIVAS:    Hey.

18          DAVID GAVALDON:  How you doing?

19          JOE OLIVAS:    Okay.

20          DAVID GAVALDON:  How was the drive?

21          JOE OLIVAS:    Oh, it was fast.

22          DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

23          JOE OLIVAS:    I want to show you my little cut too.  
24 I got my little --

25          DAVID GAVALDON:  How -- how did it work out?

1           JOE OLIVAS: Yeah. They pop it -- they got him  
2 out six inches the tube.

3           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. You look good.

4           JOE OLIVAS: In my stomach. It had the bleeding  
5 ulcers and the polyps.

6           DAVID GAVALDON: So that's what it was, the  
7 bleeding?

8           JOE OLIVAS: Yeah. Yeah. I stopped bleeding.  
9 I'm not bleeding no more.

10          DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, that's good.

11          JOE OLIVAS: And poop.

12          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

13          JOE OLIVAS: That's what I was doing.

14          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

15          JOE OLIVAS: Plus being anemic and everything.

16          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

17          JOE OLIVAS: All this vitamins and stuff is giving  
18 me.

19          DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, yeah.

20          JOE OLIVAS: I feel more energetic and wanting to  
21 do stuff.

22          DAVID GAVALDON: You look good.

23          JOE OLIVAS: Thanks.

24          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

25          JOE OLIVAS: Then Sylvia said you can't do that

1 you're too old now. You can't do that stuff. Yeah,  
2 right.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Say when we get 80 years old  
4 you'll be old.

5 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: No. Still young, man. How long  
7 it take you to get here?

8 JOE OLIVAS: An hour and 15 minutes.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, that's not bad.

10 JOE OLIVAS: We were flying.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

12 JOE OLIVAS: Well, traffic was good.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

14 JOE OLIVAS: Real good. No problem at all.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

16 JOE OLIVAS: These two knuckleheads they went to  
17 sleep and I kept on boogying.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

19 JOE OLIVAS: And they needed the rest 'cause they  
20 got up early, real early to get -- get ready and  
21 everything.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

23 JOE OLIVAS: So I slept more and woke me up and  
24 let's go.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: That's good. Yeah. I'll

1 probably be gone tomorrow.

2 JOE OLIVAS: Tomorrow?

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Probably. Either Sunday --  
4 'cause I'm thinking since they -- took me -- brought me  
5 down last Sunday they might take me back up Sunday  
6 morning.

7 JOE OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: You know, if not Monday for sure.

9 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: 'Cause they don't -- they don't  
11 want me here.

12 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

14 JOE OLIVAS: Have to worry about watching you.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: Just -- just they're thinking  
16 that I'm going to take over the prison or something,  
17 man. It's just sad. I was telling Sylvia today I need  
18 like a three-car escort all the way to CCB and downtown  
19 L.A., helicopter. They had a hood over my head.

20 JOE OLIVAS: Oh, brother.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: It was sad.

22 JOE OLIVAS: A hood over your head?

23 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

24 JOE OLIVAS: Golly. What are you -- are you going  
25 to memorize the way you traveling?

1 DAVID GAVALDON: Sad.

2 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Well, they thought -- right away  
4 they're thinking that somebody is going to try to break  
5 me out, you know.

6 JOE OLIVAS: Oh, yeah.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: And then any time you have a case  
8 that's this high profile; right, they're concerning  
9 certain people they take those precautions, but it's a  
10 little too -- they over exaggerate the security need.

11 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. So do these people here.

13 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah. Overkill.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. I wasn't even back from  
15 court over here when they're on the phone calling up  
16 Pelican Bay; this guy is ready to go now, you know.

17 JOE OLIVAS: Oh, man.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: But, see, now way Pelican Bay  
19 does it now, see, they're responsible for their  
20 transports. So if Pelican Bay brings me down Pelican  
21 Bay got to come back and bring me, they got to take me  
22 back. These people won't do it.

23 JOE OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: So, I guess, that's probably why  
25 I made it today. 'Cause they got to drive all the way

1 back down here.

2 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: So -- but we'll go straight back  
4 up, though. When I came down Sunday it was five-hour  
5 drive straight to here. So it will take --

6 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah. I read your letter that that  
7 you feel like it's a vacation for you.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: It's a vacation for me. I like  
9 it, you know.

10 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah, that's good.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

12 JOE OLIVAS: Good.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: It's good, though. I met some  
14 good guys around here, you know.

15 JOE OLIVAS: Have you?

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Meet some new faces, you  
17 know.

18 JOE OLIVAS: Good.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. So --

20 JOE OLIVAS: Good.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: Wasn't for nothing, you know.

22 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah.

23 DAVID GAVALDON: I was kind of hoping that you  
24 guys made it. I knew that the phone calls --

25 JOE OLIVAS: Oh, yeah. We -- we were doing our

1 best.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

3 JOE OLIVAS: And I was praying and she was crying  
4 her head off. Said, come on, God is going to do it.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

6 JOE OLIVAS: And sure enough she called all happy.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. That's good, man. Good  
8 seeing you guys.

9 JOE OLIVAS: And we'll be seeing you pretty soon.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11 JOE OLIVAS: All three of us will be going.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. I'll be back in the same  
13 place. They'll put me back in the same damn cell.

14 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: 'Cause that's the way they do it.

16 JOE OLIVAS: Yeah. Yeah.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: They don't want us anywhere else.

18 JOE OLIVAS: Is there anything else I can get you  
19 -- send you that you can think of right now?

20 DAVID GAVALDON: No. 'Cause I won't need nothing  
21 here.

22 JOE OLIVAS: No, no, no. Over there. To send  
23 over --

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, over there. Oh, when I get  
25 back try to send me some envelopes.

1           JOE OLIVAS: The white ones?  
2           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah -- no, the Boss envelopes.  
3           JOE OLIVAS: The Boss envelopes?  
4           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
5           JOE OLIVAS: Okay. For sure.  
6           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. I'll be needing those when  
7 I get back.  
8           JOE OLIVAS: What about papers?  
9           DAVID GAVALDON: What -- writing paper?  
10          JOE OLIVAS: Yeah.  
11          DAVID GAVALDON: No. I got some of that.  
12          JOE OLIVAS: How about postcards, stamps?  
13          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. You could send some of  
14 those.  
15          JOE OLIVAS: And stamped envelopes; right?  
16          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
17          JOE OLIVAS: Okay.  
18          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
19          JOE OLIVAS: I'll get that for you.  
20          DAVID GAVALDON: I was going to have them here to  
21 leave to the guys, but I don't think I'm going to get  
22 it. Yeah, I'll be gone.  
23          JOE OLIVAS: Yeah.  
24          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
25          JOE OLIVAS: Okay. Well, good. Let me talk --

1 give you back to Sylvia --

2 DAVID GAVALDON: All right. Take care of

3 yourself.

4 JOE OLIVAS: -- Monica, whoever. Let them fight.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: All right.

6 JOE OLIVAS: I love you.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: I love you too.

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE: 20 minutes.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: We have 20 minutes.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So Roy -- I had told Roy I said,

12 Roy. I said you got to let him come and visit you.

13 I'm already going to go visit David again.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he goes, oh, that's okay. You

16 know what, go visit him and then you can come and visit

17 me.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. When's -- when's his

19 contact going to be back?

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: His what?

21 DAVID GAVALDON: His contact visits?

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: His contact visits he doesn't even

23 tell me.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: It changes. Sometimes he'll say,

1 well, only six months and then it will be good and then  
2 it changes. I don't know if he keeps getting in  
3 trouble or --

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Well, that's what like I  
5 said over there it's 90 days and then if you keep  
6 repeating getting in trouble then they jack it up to  
7 six months. So cancellation of visits and then up to a  
8 year. The highest it can go is up to two years.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I think -- I think, myself, that  
10 somebody else is visiting him. He's got a girl  
11 visiting him.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: I wouldn't doubt it.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Because, you know -- and he -- he  
14 knows he can't let me know that.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

16 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know, I already cut Julie off,  
17 but, I mean, it will be worse 'cause then all the whole  
18 family will be mad 'cause he's over here saying he  
19 loves her and his family -- you know, people do stuff  
20 for her.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But he -- he keeps changing it.  
23 So -- and he just -- so when you see David just, you  
24 know, tell him that I send my love.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: I'm trying to determine whether

1 or not this guy is still on -- on good terms.

2 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: With the rest the fellas right  
4 there.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah, he is. He is. He's, you  
6 know, he's getting along good. And, you know, just  
7 that he doesn't -- you know, even though I know. I  
8 told him I know what happened, Roy.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You got into a fight over  
11 something. You know.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Over Julie.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: I thought that they had a riot  
15 over there.

16 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Wasn't that -- I thought that  
18 Nancy -- I thought Nancy had mentioned it they had  
19 fight with the negros or something.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: No. No. I don't know. That  
21 could have been recently another one, but I don't know.  
22 And Julie she wrote a letter to my house and I had to  
23 destroy it 'cause she's so stupid.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: The fact that it came to my house

1 got me so mad I could -- I just --

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She's an idiot.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah, I know. Yeah. Yeah.

5 She --

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Because she wrote this letter and  
7 I -- I read it before, you know, taking care of it and  
8 I -- I go, oh, no. I said, no way. No way. This  
9 letter is not going to get mailed out of here or  
10 anywhere.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

12 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And I have to tell Roy.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I'm going to tell him the truth.  
15 I had to destroy it.

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. 'Cause they -- they log  
17 the letters up there. And then they just -- 'cause --  
18 that's how come I tell you never do anything for them  
19 fools because then they try to tie you into to some  
20 type of conspiracy or something.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: You know, that's how come like I  
23 told you before I never involve you in none of my  
24 business because it's none of your business. You know,  
25 and then 'cause I know that these people already got

1 your phones taps or else are watching you. I'm telling  
2 you, these people are so damn paranoid. Every minute  
3 they're thinking that we're doing something. We're  
4 going to take over the world.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: And then they try to see who we  
7 associate with, our family members, who they --what  
8 they're doing. And they're all snaking them. They've  
9 already done it to friends out there on the street.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Is SST, is Special Services Unit  
12 they go to these guys and they tell them, you know, do  
13 you know who this guy is? You know, and why you  
14 writing him? Do you know that you use could lose your  
15 family and they're intimidating them. By law they  
16 can't do that. But they do it because -- and then it's  
17 not even a -- you know, they're there -- work for the  
18 CDC so they really don't have that capacity to go over  
19 there and threaten these people about it. But they do  
20 it in hopes to intimidate them to cut down our  
21 communication.

22 And that's the whole thing that they're doing  
23 over there in Pelican Bay right now by putting us in  
24 those four units. They got everybody in the four units  
25 and it's just to isolate us. To -- we don't even see

1 the other general population. And this is the hole.

2 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Right.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: We don't even see them. So they  
4 segregate us from those guys and they just monitor what  
5 we say. 'Cause in their minds they're feeling if we  
6 could cut these guy's communication down then we could  
7 stop them from promoting whatever it is they think  
8 we're doing.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: But then they take it to the  
12 extreme. You know. It's sad, you know.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I know.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Did you call that she/he?

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Call who?

16 DAVID GAVALDON: The she/he for the cards?

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: No, I didn't call her.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I didn't call her. I got the  
20 letter yesterday.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And then when I talked to the --  
23 the -- your friend's -- Mike's wife.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I didn't do anything 'cause I

1 thought you're going to be going right back and it's  
2 going to hold all your mail.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. She -- see, the thing is  
4 she probably already sent them. See, now what they're  
5 going to do, the stupid Pelican Bay, what they do is  
6 all my mail since I'm not there they're send it over  
7 here.

8 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh, my God.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Then once they get it then they  
10 got to send it back, you know. They -- I'm telling you  
11 these people -- last time I was down here when I went  
12 to Tracy right there in Delano.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: My stuff went to Delano, then it  
15 went to Tracy, then it went back to Pelican Bay. Oh,  
16 man, it's -- it's sad.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Oh, yeah. When they had you  
18 hopping all over.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I think they do it to get  
21 overtime.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: Huh?

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I think they do it to get overtime  
24 'cause they get good money.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, these guys are making like

1 90, a hundred thousand dollars a year.

2 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Wow.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: They make 7,000 a month just on  
4 overtime. It's a scam.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Wow.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: They don't even need the  
7 overtime. They just -- they -- they tell each other,  
8 hey, man, don't work Friday so that I can take your  
9 slot over the overtime. And that's how they do it they  
10 just buddy system.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Wow.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Most -- this the most beautiful  
13 racket in the world. If any organized crime is  
14 happening it's in here at CDC.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Exactly. Well, see, that's what I  
16 tell Joe all the time.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I said they're -- they're making  
19 accusations and they really come down on people --

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- for committing crimes and  
22 conspiracy only all that.

23 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And the government does that. The  
25 president does it. This guy Liby, the -- the -- you

1 know.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Slap in the face.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he's out there giving points  
4 in.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: That was a slap in the face right  
6 there.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And I tell (Inaudible) I said look  
8 at that -- remember -- I mean, Joe. I said, remember,  
9 how I was telling you how the -- there's a good ol'  
10 boys club.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

12 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And -- and they send our boys to  
13 prison for it, but they get away with it and not only  
14 that now his sentence is forgiven. And this is  
15 happening all over all the time.

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Yeah. Well, these --

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: On our dime.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: That's what these Bushes -- like,  
19 he's loyal to the people that were loyal to him that's  
20 why he did it, you know.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: That's terrible.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: That will slap in the face.

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: They're just protecting  
24 themselves.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Everybody is protecting themselves  
2 and everybody gets a cut. You know, there's a little  
3 reward -- financial rewards in it too.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So it's a -- see.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Everybody does it.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. It's all good. How is  
9 everybody doing?

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Well, Kimmie is doing good. She's  
11 real skinny. Her face looks a little drawn, you know,  
12 a little drawn. And she looks a little older even  
13 though she's -- she's very slim.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she's still struggling with  
16 the issues overeating. You know, 'cause it's still in  
17 the head.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And that's why I think it's bad to  
20 get the surgery 'cause you still got the issues in the  
21 head that's got to be dealt with.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And you're still the same person  
24 here, but you can't eat the food so you -- I think it's  
25 worse.

1           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And she told Monica the other day  
3 she exercises to keep her mind off food.  And she's  
4 real slim now.

5           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

6           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  She doesn't need to lose any more  
7 weight.

8           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

9           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  But the other day she told Monica  
10 that she ate three tacos.  And -- and her stomach is  
11 real little.  Her stomach is real little like that.  
12 Like that.

13          DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

14          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And -- and she -- if she put three  
15 tac- -- I don't know how she did it.  But she stuck  
16 three tacos in that pouch and she got sick.

17          DAVID GAVALDON:  They can't reserve that?

18          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And she wants to vomit.

19          DAVID GAVALDON:  They can't --

20          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  No, it's not reversible.  They  
21 yanked it out.  Like, there's a one that they staple or  
22 they put a tape on it, that's reversible.  But this one  
23 is permanent 'cause they took -- took it out.  But her  
24 stomach can stretch again.

25          DAVID GAVALDON:  Maybe that's what she's trying to

1 do.

2 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She's stretching it. And then she  
3 probably sees Richard eating so she probably wants to  
4 eat what Richard is eating.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And now Richard is going to have  
7 the surgery too. Now, I think Kimmie is stronger than  
8 Richard emotionally, mentally. So when Richard has it  
9 he's going to go through more changes --

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: -- then Kimmie because he -- he  
12 has really -- he's really bad.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He's really bad. And he doesn't  
15 walk around and exercise. He hasn't worked for almost  
16 three years I think it is now. Yeah, three years this  
17 year.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: This July he hasn't worked. And  
20 -- but he's -- you know, he -- he doesn't listen. He  
21 has emotional problems too.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. His kids, man, that's  
23 where the kids took after him.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah, you know, Kimmie is not  
25 working she's on disability 'cause they fixed her

1 (Inaudible).

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Richard hasn't worked in three  
4 years and Jeremy's been on disability too.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: All them together.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: And Jeremy they're not -- he's  
8 not considering going back with Kristine.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He would like to go back with  
10 Kristine; he loves her. But she is like a rich -- rich  
11 man's daughter.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he has a lot of properties.  
14 He has money. He's well-to-do.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

16 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He lives in an over a million  
17 dollar house. And he -- she's a spoiled girl and she  
18 wants the -- she wanted Jeremy to get two jobs so that  
19 they could do better.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So she's very demanding. And she  
22 -- she wants, I guess, a guy with money now. Well, she  
23 didn't -- she knew what she got when she married him.  
24 But he didn't make a lot of money.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And then he smoked and she -- then  
2 she wanted him to stop smoking. And things got bad  
3 when they went to live with her father and mother.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: That's when things went bad. And  
6 the pressure was on Jeremy real bad then to stop  
7 smoking.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And now she said that she thinks  
10 it better for them to, you know, that it's over. She  
11 told him about two weeks ago. And he feels -- he feels  
12 real bad about it.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Well it's his fault, you know.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

15 DAVID GAVALDON: But she obviously don't care for  
16 him so why even waste his time worrying about it, you  
17 know.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Well, she -- she loves money more  
19 than she loves Jeremy.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Obviously, she doesn't love Jeremy  
22 she's going to leave him.

23 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know, over if he's not going  
25 to get a second job and stop smoking.

1           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS: She told him you can come back  
3 home if you stop smoking. He stopped smoking she  
4 didn't have him come back home. So when he was taking  
5 medication for being depressed over all of it.

6           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

7           SYLVIA OLIVAS: And it helped him to stop smoking,  
8 the medication. So he stopped the smoking and now  
9 he's, you know, now he went back to smoking. But it's  
10 pretty hopeless, I think, with her.

11          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

12          SYLVIA OLIVAS: She's just -- but then -- guy,  
13 they're making a lot of noise over here with the  
14 chairs.

15          DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

16          SYLVIA OLIVAS: She -- she gets jealous when he  
17 gets with another woman.

18          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

19          SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he was going with another  
20 woman before she went back with him and they got  
21 married.

22          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

23          SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he was dating -- I think she  
24 was Vietnamese, Asian, some kind of girl.

25          DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she was trying to -- he was  
2 trying to hook up with her. And then I guess she found  
3 out about it. And she grabbed him back right away.  
4 But she's not -- she's not a good woman for Jeremy.  
5 DAVID GAVALDON: Don't sound like it at all.  
6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know.  
7 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
8 SYLVIA OLIVAS: The money is a big thing.  
9 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.  
10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she likes to shop at real  
11 expensive stores. And she likes to wear -- she wears  
12 always nice clothes. Like, her purse matches with her  
13 shoes. She's that kind of person.  
14 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Where, you know, she likes to  
16 dress up a lot and have her hair done all the time.  
17 And, you know.  
18 DAVID GAVALDON: She could stay home then.  
19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah. She --  
20 DAVID GAVALDON: With her parents.  
21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she doesn't want to work. She  
22 doesn't want to help him.  
23 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She wants him to take care of her  
25 and meet all those needs.

1           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  So she's hap- -- you know, Jeremy  
3 is very sad about it.

4           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

5           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And I'm sad because of Joshua.

6           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

7           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  The little boy, you know, he needs  
8 his dad.  And now he got his dad back for what, almost  
9 two years I think.

10          DAVID GAVALDON:  Uh-huh.

11          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  He'd been married and now his dad  
12 is gone so that, you know, that probably he's going to  
13 get mixed up.

14          DAVID GAVALDON:  So Kimmie still get to see the  
15 kid, though?

16          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  Does she still see the -- the boy?  
17 Well, we --

18          DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.  I mean, she doesn't play  
19 that with the kid?  She doesn't try to keep the kid  
20 from the grandparents?

21          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  Yeah.  She -- she didn't let him  
22 come for the 4th of July.  And whenever we had family  
23 gatherings Kristine didn't always come.

24          DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

25          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And when Kristine did come to

1 parties and stuff.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She would always just sit next to  
4 Jeremy. She didn't -- she didn't, like, mingle with  
5 us.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she -- she didn't want to talk  
8 to with us.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And you try to talk to her and,  
11 you know, can't make no conversation with her. She's  
12 -- so I don't know if she doesn't like us or -- we  
13 don't have enough money. I don't know. But, you know,  
14 and we all tried with her. You know. We -- we really  
15 tried with her.

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But she's just --

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Worthless.

19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah. She's -- she's not good for  
20 Jeremy. I hope he finds somebody else.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He needs to go get himself that  
23 Asian girl back.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Might as well. How about Sonya?  
25 How's Sonya doing?

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Sonya is still having trouble with  
2 her female problems like Monica was. But she doesn't  
3 take care of it.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know, she doesn't go to the  
6 doctor. And she -- she doesn't take care of herself.  
7 And I bug her. But then when I put pressure on her to  
8 go to the doctor she gets mad at me and she gets upset.  
9 So I'm just going to leave her alone and she's going to  
10 have to decide to take care of her own body.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

12 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But I don't think she's going to  
13 ~~have any children~~ taking care of herself and she's  
14 letting the -- the problem in her ovaries, you  
15 know, progress.

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And not -- not -- she's not  
18 monitoring it.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Or taking care of it like she  
21 should. She was supposed to have surgery.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she canceled it. And then she  
24 was supposed -- she promised me she would do it again  
25 in June and she didn't do it.

1           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  So -- so I haven't asked her  
3 anymore about it.  And Joseph gets real mad with her,  
4 real mad, because, you know, they're very close.

5           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

6           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And he's afraid she's going to  
7 die.

8           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

9           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  So -- but Joseph -- Joseph called  
10 me when I -- I sent everybody a little email in the  
11 computer.

12          DAVID GAVALDON:  Uh-huh.

13          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  To let them know you were up here.

14          DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

15          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And he said to say -- he sends his  
16 love and hellos too.

17          DAVID GAVALDON:  Uh-huh.

18          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And so I was surprised.

19          DAVID GAVALDON:  Till about 18 years.

20          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  I know.  And he's working with  
21 some kids that are involved in, like, in gangs and  
22 they're -- they're disabled kids, they're mentally  
23 challenged.

24          DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

25          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  Monica says behavioral problems

1 and learning disabled.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And they challenge him a lot, but  
4 he's really connected with them.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And so -- with a couple of them  
7 he's talked a little bit, you know, his uncles and the  
8 ones that he trust and all that.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And -- and I don't know. That --  
11 that's seems to have made a connection. Like, the  
12 connection that he has with them.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He -- I don't know. His attitude  
15 seems to be better.

16 DAVID GAVALDON: That's good.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know, and I like -- I'm glad  
18 about that.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know. But they give him a lot  
21 of trouble 'cause they threaten his life and all that.  
22 He goes, I wish I could tell them something. You know,  
23 threaten them back, but he can't.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But he likes his job.

1           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS: So he's doing good. He doesn't  
3 have a girlfriend. You know why?

4           DAVID GAVALDON: Why is that?

5           SYLVIA OLIVAS: He's got a big mouth. He's like  
6 dad. He speaks his mind too much with people.

7           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

8           SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he tells them off. He is a  
9 lot like dad. He tells them -- he tells them out. And  
10 -- and I -- and he loves it. He's proud that he --  
11 when I tell him you're like grandpa you can't be like  
12 that.

13          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

14          SYLVIA OLIVAS: And, you know, he says thank you  
15 when I tell you're like grandpa. He says, "Thank you."  
16 So that, you know, I'm not going to tell him that  
17 anymore 'cause it encourages him.

18          DAVID GAVALDON: I'll come sooner or later. I  
19 guess, he just don't -- he going be like Robert --  
20 Bobby and Gavette. He ain't going to have no children.

21          SYLVIA OLIVAS: God, I know.

22          DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

23          SYLVIA OLIVAS: He wants to.

24          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

25          SYLVIA OLIVAS: But he -- I think that's his

1 problem that he needs to, like, be more settle and, you  
2 know, to get a woman. They don't want somebody that's  
3 going be too rough.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: He's a big kid, man. I've seen  
7 the pictures, man.

8 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Big boy.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He's very big. He's very tall.  
11 And Danielle was supposed to have her -- her tubes  
12 tied.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Oh, yeah.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So she wouldn't have anymore  
15 babies.

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But we suspect between you and me.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: That he's got another chick behind  
20 Danielle's back.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And, see, the -- one of the  
23 reasons he's with Nancy and he takes -- they fight a  
24 lot Danielle and him.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: The reason he's with Nancy 'cause  
2 his mother won't take him back.  
3 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She -- she left him homeless.  
5 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Nancy took him off the street.  
7 Excuse me. And Nancy cares for him; is trying to help  
8 him.  
9 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she's very patient 'cause she  
11 wants the relationship to work.  
12 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she doesn't want Danielle to  
14 start messing up again 'cause Danielle was doing really  
15 good.  
16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Has been doing good since she's  
18 been married.  
19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: As far as we know.  
21 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But somebody at our house.  
23 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.  
24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Took \$40.00 from Kimmie's purses  
25 on the 4th of July when they came to our house.

1           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And Kimmie said it was Chris.  And  
3 I said, well, I -- I know that Joseph was in the living  
4 room all the time.  He didn't go outside when everybody  
5 was in the pool.

6           DAVID GAVALDON:  Uh-huh.

7           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  She goes, well, the only one that  
8 can be suspected is Chris.  Out of the whole family  
9 he's the only one that I think did it.  And so she  
10 called Danielle and told her and what she thought.  And  
11 she -- and they talked -- Chris talked to Kimmie and  
12 said, well, I didn't take it.  But he says I'll give it  
13 back to you.  And I go, well, that told her right  
14 there.  Right there.

15          DAVID GAVALDON:  He take it.

16          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  I'll give it back.  So he probably  
17 did.  And then Liz told Kimmie that she has a little  
18 money missing from her purse one day too.  So I don't  
19 know if it's Danielle or Chris.  But everybody suspects  
20 Chris.  And Liz said I think it's Chris because he --  
21 he -- I think he has a girlfriend 'cause he goes to  
22 work extra early and all that.

23          DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

24          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And he puts cologne Liz said when  
25 he's going to work.

1           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS: How's Liz doing?

3           DAVID GAVALDON: Liz is -- well, you know, we  
4 don't talk as much as we used to. Every since she  
5 separated with -- with Michael. Michael Harwood who  
6 says he works in a state prison in Arizona.  
7 believe it.

8           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

9           SYLVIA OLIVAS: I don't believe that at all.

10          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11          SYLVIA OLIVAS: He's a liar.

12          DAVID GAVALDON: Why would he go somewhere there?

13          SYLVIA OLIVAS: When -- when a woman can make you  
14 cry -- when a woman can make you cry you know that you  
15 can't -- you can't work in a prison.

16          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

17          SYLVIA OLIVAS: When one of the guys -- because I  
18 -- the guy that (Inaudible) giving him a dirty look.

19          DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

20          SYLVIA OLIVAS: And so he's -- you know, and --  
21 so ever since she separated with him I think Liz --  
22 because we encourage her to leave him 'cause we knew  
23 circumstances of their marriage was no good and he was  
24 stepping out on her and all that.

25          DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And I just -- he was just dirt.  
2 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.  
3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And we never liked him from the  
4 beginning.  
5 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But we endured him for all these  
7 ten years of marriage for Liz's sake.  
8 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: We treated him like a decent human  
10 being even though they didn't deserve it, David.  
11 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
12 SYLVIA OLIVAS: We did treat him like a decent  
13 human being.  
14 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And because we, you know, wanted  
16 to keep Liz happy.  
17 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.  
18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Even though we knew he was rotten  
19 Liz wanted him.  
20 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.  
21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So what happened was now that they  
22 -- they separated and we encourage Liz and she saw him  
23 for what he was 'cause he moved in that woman to the  
24 house where they were living.  
25 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

1 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And so -- so that was really bad.  
2 That was really bad.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And then Liz saw, you know, him  
5 for what he was. But at the same time I know she's mad  
6 at me and -- and she's mad at Monica because she knows  
7 that -- and she's says I know that nobody ever -- never  
8 liked Michael. And so I said, well, yeah, but we, you  
9 know, because of you.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And we always treated him right.  
12 He can never say that we never said anything to him,  
13 not even boo.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Only two times in -- in his life  
16 that I've known him I have threatened him.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he -- it was just cause.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And so, you know, I -- I -- and I  
21 told him, you know, when we move Liz out of the house  
22 and he -- he told Liz -- he called her on the cell  
23 phone inside the house and -- 'cause Liz was plenty --  
24 she was pissed off when we were moving her out. She  
25 was mad. She was hot. But she cooled off after that.

1 That's why she's mad at us.

2 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

3 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she -- he called her in the  
4 house and -- and then Liz tells me, Michael said to get  
5 my ass in the garage. I go, okay, let's go. Come on.

6 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

7 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And I went in there with Liz and  
8 he -- he knew when he saw me that she had told me.

9 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

10 SYLVIA OLIVAS: 'Cause he's afraid of me. So she  
11 sic -- she knew that I was going to go in there and get  
12 him.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I wanted to jump him, but I wanted  
15 him to hit me first so he -- I wouldn't go to jail.  
16 And then I had everybody behind me. Oh, Joe and little  
17 Roy was there. Everybody was standing behind me like,  
18 you know.

19 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: We're ready to pounce on him.  
21 But, you know, I know Liz was right -- like right there  
22 waiting to get between us 'cause Roy and Mike -- Roy  
23 wanted to kick Michael's butt one time.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: When he was at home.

1           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And Liz got -- and Roy was going  
3 to get him and we swept the floor with him.

4           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

5           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  But Liz got him for -- in the  
6 middle of him and she stopped him and, darn it, I wish  
7 Liz hadn't been home.

8           DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

9           SYLVIA OLIVAS:  That would have been a little  
10 taste for him.

11          DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

12          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And so I told him I said, you  
13 know, Michael, I said I can't believe that you would  
14 treat my sister like this.  I said, you know my  
15 brothers.

16          DAVID GAVALDON:  Uh-huh.

17          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  He goes, I'm not afraid of your  
18 brothers.  I go, oh, really.  Well, that's good.  
19 That's good.  Okay.

20          DAVID GAVALDON:  Yeah.

21          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And now -- and when Liz filed his  
22 divorce papers -- Liz had filed her divorce papers he  
23 wouldn't let himself be served.

24          DAVID GAVALDON:  Oh, yeah.

25          SYLVIA OLIVAS:  And I told Liz I said the reason

1 he doesn't want to let himself be served is because  
2 he's afraid that somebody else is going to come and  
3 meet him. He's -- he's scared.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he told Liz I have a gun.  
6 Anybody comes to the door I'm going to shoot them. I  
7 go, oh, yeah, somebody is going to come. If anybody  
8 ever did in his life that didn't like him 'cause  
9 there's other people that don't like him.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: They're going to come say,  
12 Michael, come on out.

13 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah, he's a coward.

14 SYLVIA OLIVAS: So, anyways, so I've been -- well,  
15 lately he's been wanting Liz to -- now he wants to get  
16 served. I think he's got another woman that he wants  
17 to marry and he's been bugging Liz for the divorce.

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And -- but he doesn't want to give  
20 the address where he lives. I go, he's afraid. He's  
21 running scared. I said I'm glad he's running scared.  
22 Let him live 90 years, a hundred years 'cause till the  
23 day he dies he's going to be scared.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. It's eating him up.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he told Liz -- he told Liz I

1 want to move out of Arizona that's why I want the  
2 divorce.

3 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And then he said, oh, I got  
5 accepted to be a federal correction officer. And I  
6 just have to decide where -- which federal prison I  
7 want to go to. I go, baloney. I said, he will not go  
8 to no federal prison. I said, I hope my phones are  
9 monitored at home 'cause Michael Harwood is associated  
10 to Liz Gavaldon, who's associated to Roy David  
11 Gavaldon. I don't think so.

12 DAVID GAVALDON: No. They won't.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: He's stupid.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. I don't even believe he's  
15 working over there.

16 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I don't think so.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: I don't think so.

18 SYLVIA OLIVAS: But he's -- he, like, has that  
19 behind him. He thinks that behind him.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Just protection or something.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

23 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And he's scared. He's afraid.

24 And I go, well, I'm glad for the ten years of hell that  
25 Liz lived.

1           DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

2           SYLVIA OLIVAS: I'm glad that he has to live like  
3 that always, you know, checking.

4           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

5           SYLVIA OLIVAS: And that in itself is his  
6 punishment.

7           DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Well, with Liz she ain't  
8 filed the divorce? I thought it was over.

9           SYLVIA OLIVAS: She filed for the papers, but  
10 because they never served him they couldn't complete  
11 it.

12          DAVID GAVALDON: But they don't need that.

13          SYLVIA OLIVAS: That's what she said. See, Liz  
14 doesn't really want to go let of Michael.

15          DAVID GAVALDON: That's --

16          SYLVIA OLIVAS: So she tells her own little  
17 stories.

18          DAVID GAVALDON: No. 'Cause I could file divorce  
19 myself. And that's what the unreciprocal spouse if  
20 they refuse to sign or give an address then the judge  
21 will automatically determine the -- the marriage  
22 annulled or divorce.

23          SYLVIA OLIVAS: Uh-huh.

24          DAVID GAVALDON: That's not a required -- it's not  
25 a requirement to get the spouses. Because the spouse

1 in some cases might refuse to sign. But that doesn't  
2 mean that -- that precludes the person filing the  
3 divorce to get the divorce.

4 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I see.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: She's -- she's lying.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah.

7 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. 'Cause I could do it.

8 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I don't know. I think she still  
9 has that hope.

10 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

11 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know. And she said that she  
12 -- she said, you think he wants to marry somebody else?  
13 I said, I think Michael wants to cut his ties with you.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: 'Cause he wants to cut his ties  
16 with all of us. You're family. He's afraid of us.

17 DAVID GAVALDON: He knows he can't come back.  
18 Heck, with anything, then he is in reach. He don't  
19 want that.

20 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And then he asked Liz, oh, I -- I  
21 can't go to Victorville 'cause isn't Roy still there?  
22 And I told Monica I said he knows. He probably just  
23 want to know if Roy got out.

24 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Yeah.

25 SYLVIA OLIVAS: You know. Is Roy still over

1           there?

2           DAVID GAVALDON:   That boy something else.   That's  
3           good.   'Cause -- well, at least you know he's paranoid  
4           and --

5           SYLVIA OLIVAS:   He's very paranoid.   He's very  
6           afraid.   And that's how he's going to live the rest of  
7           his life.   Whether he goes to -- like he told her he's  
8           going to go to another state and buy property and that  
9           he's going to go away.   He's going to get lost, you  
10          know.   But he is a coward.   He's a -- he is a coward.  
11          That's no doubt about it.

12          DAVID GAVALDON:   Yeah.

13          SYLVIA OLIVAS:   He's dead.   Roy says -- Roy told  
14          me the other day he says, man, he asked me about Liz  
15          too.   And I -- and I -- he says, I wish I could --  
16          before I die I would like to see Michael one more time.

17          DAVID GAVALDON:   Well, he will virtually.   I pray  
18          for the same thing.   Yeah, boy, boy.

19          SYLVIA OLIVAS:   But Liz is living a better life.  
20          She looks better.   And she's happier and her life is  
21          more full now.   And pretty soon she might be buying a  
22          car, but she's still going through these feelings and I  
23          know she has a lot of anger toward me.

24          DAVID GAVALDON:   Uh-huh.

25          SYLVIA OLIVAS:   And Monica.   And we don't have

1 that much communication with each other because of her  
2 -- her feelings, her anger. And she has to get over  
3 it. See, she should be angry at him.

4 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah, I know.

5 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And instead she's having anger  
6 toward us. And she, you know, she gets along good with  
7 Nancy and she's doing better with Kimmie. But for a  
8 long time she wouldn't even talk to Kimmie and she --  
9 she rarely talked us to me and she rarely talks to  
10 Monica anymore.

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Uh-huh.

12 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She tells Monica, you know, I'm  
13 ~~being to come and she not she there is what~~ -- that wall  
14 between us and I know it's 'cause of Michael.

15  
16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

17 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Because --

18 DAVID GAVALDON: Well, she don't write me.

19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: And she probably doesn't like it  
20 what I said.

21 DAVID GAVALDON: She don't write me.

22 SYLVIA OLIVAS: One minute.

23 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Yeah, she don't write me.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah. Well --

25 DAVID GAVALDON: Even when she says she going to

1 write me, yeah.

2 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I don't know why she is the way  
3 she is with you, but -- you know, she's -- she -- I  
4 don't know.

5 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

6 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She needs some counseling,  
7 honestly.

8 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah.

9 SYLVIA OLIVAS: She does need counseling. I'm not  
10 kidding. But --

11 DAVID GAVALDON: Well, give her -- everybody else  
12 my love anyway.

13 SYLVIA OLIVAS: I will.

14 DAVID GAVALDON: Thank you for coming.

15 SYLVIA OLIVAS: Yeah, I'm glad we came.

16 DAVID GAVALDON: Yeah. Good to see. You all look  
17 good. She's losing weight, you're losing weight, he's  
18 losing weight.

19 SYLVIA OLIVAS: We're trying.

20 DAVID GAVALDON: All right, man. I got to --

21 SYLVIA OLIVAS: We'll see you in August.

22 DAVID GAVALDON: All right. Take care of  
23 yourself.

24 SYLVIA OLIVAS: In a few weeks.

25 DAVID GAVALDON: All right.
